Welcome to the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre for the 12th Congress of the World Federation of Critical Care Nurses.

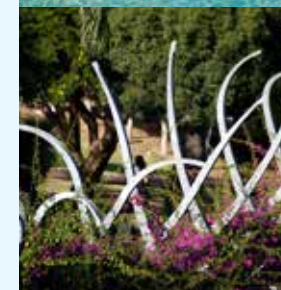
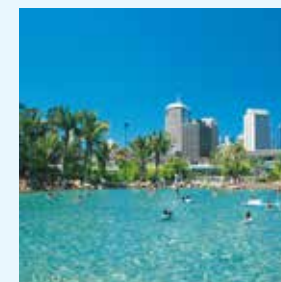
This conference opens Queensland's doors to clinically-focused presentations and debates at the highest level, offering a rare opportunity for local and international clinical networking.

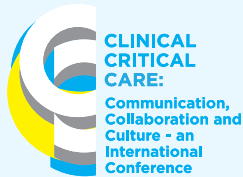

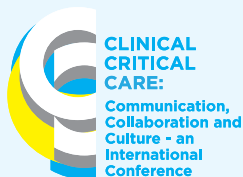

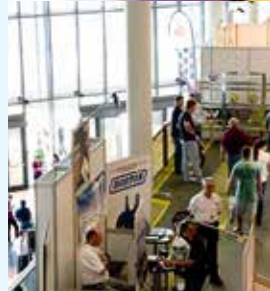
